About the Artists

K. T. Kobel (b.1988, UK). Lives and works in Amsterdam, NL.

Kobel is a figurative painter who delves into the complexities of the human condition, with a particular focus on the psychological effects of trauma. Through his style of visual obscurity and concealed meaning, he seeks to bring coherence and closure to the disorder and chaos that often arises from these experiences.

In his art, Kobel isolates fragments of time that are shrouded from their original context and transforms them into though-provoking and emotionally resonant pieces. By imbuing these fragments with newfound significance, he creates evocative symbols that capture the elusive nature of memory itself. Kobel's use of airbrush adds a soft, almost ethereal quality to his paintings, which often depict foreboding scenarios that call into question the boundaries between the mundane and the absurd.

Filippo Cegani (b. 1993, Italy) Filippo A.L. Cegani is an Italian painter based in Milan.

Cegani paints metaphors of conversations or ideas, the imagery of masculinity, projecting metaphysical paintings in the third millennia. His most recent works present research on armours and fetish gear. Both of these items have the peculiarity of masking an individual as well as protecting him. Cegani wants to create a sense of mystery in the painting, as if the image itself and its meaning is difficult to grasp, it seems to the artist that a message that is

too direct makes the audience lose focus on the vehicle of the image itself. As the artist claims, forcing someone to analyze the painting makes the conversation between the viewer And the painting more personal.

His meticulously and masterfully produced airbrush paintings explore religious and cultural Italian themes in a contemporary context. His work bridges the gap between Baroque imagery and a modern technical execution resulting in extremely high quality dreamlike modern pieces that dance along the faint line of vague familiarity and comfortable sanctuary.

RAGE (Germany)

RAGE is a one of the most important and active trainwriters in Hamburg. As a member of the Legendary DSF crew, he developed his own eye-catching style from the. With an active career starting back in 1998, he continues to evolve an even more individual and unique style plumbing from typography and graphic design.

RAGE is a German urban artist from Hamburg with a widespread international presence. He discovered his love for art as an expression of disobedience and non-conformism in the late 1990's. For over 25 years RAGE has found in graffiti and street art his creative territory. Working by himself or in collaboration with other artists, he has been exploring trains as an urban element of choice and as a substrate for his visual narrative. RAGE pushes and blurs the boundaries of graffiti, typography and fine art. His interventions are an extension of his disregard of conventional societal norms, a form of protest against the system.

Lazar Georgiev (b. 1999, Bulgaria)

Lazar Georgiev is a visual artist working in the field of painting. his work tackles the collective unconscious of eastern European nostalgia, childhood, pop-culture and counterculture, integrating the familiar objects he grew up with. The compositions resemble collage-like surrealistic scenes, creating multiple narratives through airbrush renderings of his memories and images that inspired his work.

Yuka Katsuki (Japan)

Hailing from Japan, Yuka Katsuki seamlessly weaves the essence of animation into every canvas, employing the intricate art of silk-screening. Drawing inspiration from the fluidity of animation frames, each piece captures the dance of colors and forms with a nostalgic nod to traditional animation. Through a harmonious blend of childlike playfulness and technical precision, the artist crafts a visual symphony that radiates positivity and resonates with the viewer's sense of nostalgia. Witness the magic as vibrant hues and dynamic compositions come together to celebrate the timeless joy of animated moments on canvases that evoke both wonder and sentiment.

DANIEL LOPEZ (B. 1982 USA)

Lopez discovered his passion for art after overcoming a lifelong struggle with heroin addiction. Through his art, he seeks to forge a deep rooted connection with his culture and spirituality. Drawing inspiration from the masters of renaissance art, Daniel is a classically trained oil painter renowned for his expansive murals that grace the landscapes of the west coast.
